If you are bullied:-

DO:-

- > Ask them to stop
- Use eye contact and tell them to go away

DON'T:-

- > Do what they say
- > Get angry
- > Retaliate
- > Think it's your fault
- > Hide it



What should I do if I see someone else is being bullied:-

- Don't walk away and ignore the bully
- > Tell the bully to stop if it is safe to do so.
- Don't stay silent or the bullying will keep happening.

Bullying isn't:-

- · Falling out with a friend
- Misunderstanding
- Dislike (general person)
- If your friend plays with someone else at playtime
- Accidentally hurting someone (verbally or physically)
- Rarely teasing or saying mean words
