Attendance and Lateness:

Our attendance figure for the school currently stands at 95.6%. That's in line with schools nationally, however our target is always 96%, and we consistently achieve that and above. Please note the table below.

As you can see, good attendance will give your child every opportunity to maximise their learning. Our pupils' welfare is of paramount importance to us, and we believe that regular attendance throughout the year is essential for their success and fulfilment.

The number of pupils arriving late after 8:40 is also steadily creeping up. Please be on time for the start of day as registration and learning begins at 8:40. Children who arrive late may feel uncomfortable having to walk in late to their class before their peers and may miss some key information. Just 5 minutes late each day means 3 whole days lost each year. I understand mornings can be hectic in trying to get everything ready but let us please make a huge effort for the remainder of this term to reduce the number of lates. We can do this. Thank you.

The March consultations were always planned to be in person, and we have also set a provisional date for consultations next half term which will be confirmed as soon as possible.
