Although 89% is high, 11% of responses seem hesitant in the overall offer from the school. This may be due to the lower scoring questions here, such as the after-school provision and some perceptions in the standards of behaviour. We will always endeavour to provide a rich experience for the children.

Summary

Areas that have been voiced with concern mainly include after school provision and communication. There is no doubt that the pandemic has affected everyone's approach to living today and we have been no different. We have had to make some tough choices over the months in how we have managed our situation and context.

In response to this, we have sought more after school provision after half term to enable each class an opportunity to access a club each week. Where this isn't happening straight away for a particular class, we are still trying to make this happen as soon as possible.

Communication is vitally important to us to ensure it works and you know what is happening in school. Our main platform is always the school website. We will send you emails with the school newsletter on, whilst we also publish these on the website also.

Class Dojo appears to be an effective tool to aid communication, and all classes are now up and running.

Thank you for completing the survey and persevering with some glitches. Overall, the response is really positive, and your comments are really important to us to bring about a better experience for our children and you. We will continue to strive for excellent outcomes for all of your children.
