Steve Dickenson (Dad of Joab, Arthur and Sylvie) visited school this week to talk about his job at Ecologi, a climate organisation that helps businesses to reduce their environmental impact. We talked about the importance of Collective Action – when lots of individuals do a small thing, it can have a big impact – and how we all have a part to play in fighting climate change. We also discussed the Greenhouse Gas Effect and finished with a talk on trees and the role they play in removing carbon pollution from the atmosphere. His family also funded some trees for the children – here is a link to their virtual forest – Click Here – with a tree planted for each pupil in Southern Kenya, part of a project covering six individually-defined reforestation areas totalling 5,700 hectares in area.
