Covid-19 Operational Guidance for September 2021

Our aim is that school returns to normal school practices when we return in September. It is almost two months away and anything can happen between now and then. However, as we learn to live with and manage this virus, we must still operate with a cautious approach to our risk assessment and control measures. New operational guidance (July 2021) informs we no longer need to operate 'bubbles' thus keeping all

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classes separate. We can have assemblies together again and we won't have to avoid mixing classes at lunchtime. That said, our control measures will still include:

- Good hygiene practices for everyone
- Maintain effective cleaning regimes
- Keep occupied spaces well ventilated
- Follow public health advice on testing, self-isolation and managing confirmed cases of Covid-19.

We will have an 'outbreak management plan' ready to implement if there is a requirement and bubbles need to be re-introduced as part of a local plan, if we need to reduce mixing again. Any decision to reintroduce bubbles however would not be taken lightly and would need to take account of the detrimental impact they can have on the delivery of education. I sincerely hope we don't have to go there again...

What happens if a pupil or staff member develops symptoms?

All should follow public health advice. No one should come onto the school site if they have symptoms, have a had a positive test result or other reasons requiring them to stay at home due to the risk of them passing on the virus. (e.g. quarantine)

If any pupil/adult develops symptoms, however mild, they will be sent home and should follow public health advice.

If a pupil is identified as being a 'close contact' with a positive case, they will not need to self-isolate (from 16 August). This in itself will reduce the number of pupils missing school because of isolation requirements. It will only be children/adults with confirmed positive cases that will need to isolate.

If there is any change in our approach because of the changing nature of restriction then we will advise via the school website and use our school facebook/twitter feeds.

SCHOOL TIMINGS

Our timings will return for all. Our school day begins at 8:40 and ends at 3:00. Children can start arriving between 8:20-8:40 (but please see your child through the main side gate) and wait on the school playground till classes line up and begin entry into school. NEW starters in Reception will have a 2-day transition on Thursday and Friday (2nd and 3rd) beginning at 9:00 till 12:00 and 1:00 till 3:00.

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NEW STARTERS

From Monday 6th September, we will invite parents of Reception children to bring them onto the playground outside their classroom at 8:45. This is where you will see your children into school. We then ask you to continue following the school path to exit via the Whizz Kids gate. At the end of day, you are welcome to walk around to the rear playground by this same gate and wait for your child to exit at 3:00. Once your child is confident enough in school and becomes used to routines, we encourage them to come through the gates by themselves (or with their Y6 buddy) just before the October half-term, and just before 8:40 each day.
